## Making a Will

### Are you one of the 61% of the UK population who have not made a will?

People either don't have wills, haven't updated them or told people where they are. It's a great risk for your family and your money. Here are our top tips to help you through the pretty straightforward experience.



#### 1. What do you own

Write a list of all the assets that you would like to include in your will, including property, savings and investments.



#### 2. Children under 18

If you have any children under the age of 18, it's important that you make provisions for them in your will. You may need to name a legal guardian to look after them and manage their financial matters after you have gone.



#### 3. Who gets what

Who will receive your assets after you die – your spouse, family, friends or charities.



#### 4. Executors of your will

You will need to name the people (or person) that you want to appoint as executors to your will – they will be responsible for carrying out your wishes after your death.



#### 5. Get personal advice

To ensure that your wishes are achieved on your death – we advise that you take professional advice. If your will is badly drafted there is no certainty that your wishes will be carried out.
